On 11 January, Minister for Sustainability and the Environment Grace Fu met Ms Anneke Adema, Netherlands Ambassador to Singapore, to discuss ways to enhance both countries' cooperation in coastal protection, flood resilience, circular economy, as well as food and water security.

The Netherlands will be co-hosting the UN 2023 Water Conference in March, which Singapore will be supporting and participating in. Singapore is also working with our Dutch counterparts on joint research projects in urban farming and climate adaptation.

As highly urbanised countries, Singapore and the Netherlands share similar concerns and interests. Singapore looks forward to partnering the Netherlands to advance both countries' sustainability efforts.
