#### Singapore raises climate ambition, revises carbon tax trajectory

At Budget 2022, Finance Minister Lawrence Wong announced that Singapore will raise its climate ambition to achieve net zero emissions by or around mid-century. To enable the transition to a low-carbon future, the carbon tax will be progressively raised to \$25/tCO2e in 2024 and 2025, and \$45/tCO2e in 2026 and 2027, with a view to reaching \$50-80/tCO2e by 2030.

The revised carbon tax will provide a strong price signal and impetus for businesses and individuals to reduce their carbon footprint. The revenue collected will be used to support businesses in their decarbonisation journeys and cushion the impact on households.

#### Visit by President of the United Nations General Assembly

On 6 February 2022, Minister for Sustainability and the Environment Ms Grace Fu hosted the President of the United Nations General Assembly and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Maldives, H.E. Abdulla Shahid, at the Gardens by the Bay and the Marina Barrage. At Gardens by the Bay, H.E. Shahid was briefed on the sustainability innovations built into the conservatories' design, such as energy-efficient cooling solutions and photovoltaic cells on the Supertrees. At the Marina Barrage, H.E. Shahid was briefed on Singapore's approach to water management and strategies in coastal protection. National Youth Council leaders Melissa Low and Nor Lastrina Hamid also shared with H.E. Shahid on how youths in Singapore are driving their own initiatives to fight against climate change.

#### Call by US Ambassador to Singapore


